# **Our Judge**



**Mike Jenkins** is an award-winning Welsh poet and author. He is widely published and is much in demand for his lively performances and writing workshops. He has also performed at the Hay Festival, the Aldeburgh Poetry Festival and has read and tutored at Ty Newydd, the National Writers' Centre for Wales.

He has won Wales Book of the Year in 1998 for his collection of short stories 'Wanting to Belong'. He has also won an Eric Gregory Award from the Society of Authors, The Young Writers Prize from the Welsh Arts Council for 'Empire of Smoke' and the John Tripp Award for Spoken Poetry.

Mike is at the forefront of contemporary Welsh writing and is a fellow of the Academi, the Welsh Society for Authors. He is a former editor of Poetry Wales magazine and has co-edited Red Poets for 25 years, an annual magazine of left-wing poetry from Wales and beyond.

Poetry forms the bulk of Mike's published work, though he has also written three novellas for young people and one for adults. His latest book is 'From Aberfan t Grenfell' (Cultural Matters) with artist Alan Perry.

Mike is a retired teacher of English and his last job was at Radyr Comprehensive School, Cardiff. He previously taught at Pen-y-dre High School in Merthyr for 20 years.

Mike frequently appears on radio and television and is known among Cardiff City football fans as the club's unofficial poet.

- 2. Each poem must be typed/clearly written on 1 side of paper.
- 3. No covering letter or other material should be enclosed.
- 4. No alterations can be made to a poem once it has been submitted.
- 5. The entrant may submit an unlimited number of poems, £5 per poem (£6 PayPal). We only accept sterling.
- 6. Cheques and postal orders should be made payable to:

- 7. The poem(s) should be firmly attached to the entry form. The name of the entrant must not appear on the entry itself.
- 8. Once entered, poems cannot be withdrawn from the competition. It is regretted that no entries can be returned, so keep a copy of your work.
- 9. All winners will normally be requested to provide a biography and photograph and take part in any subsequent publicity surrounding the competition.
- 10. Acknowledgement of receipt of poems will only be given if a SAE marked "Acknowledgement" is enclosed.
- 11. Entries must be in English, not previously published in any form (including appearing on the Internet).
- 12. The author must be living.
- 13. No translations are allowed.
- 14. Entries can be in any style and on any subject.
- 15. Entries should not be submitted for publication elsewhere while the competition is running.
- 16. Winners will be decided by our judge **Mike Jenkins**. His decision is final and no correspondence will be entered into.
- 17. The organisers reserve the right to change the judge if circumstances dictate.
- 18. The competition is open until Sunday 26<sup>th</sup> May 2019. All entries must reach us by that date.
- 19. All winning poems will be announced and published on our website, may be published elsewhere in the media and will also appear in a future anthology.
- 20. Copyright remains with the competitor, but The Welsh Poetry Competition reserves the right to arrange the first publication or broadcast of selected poems as it sees fit. Submission of a poem(s) implies the competitor's acceptance of the rules.
